Hanukkah Liturgy:

First night

Light the center candle, the shamash, before reciting the first blessing.

1. Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam, asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the Universe, Who has made us holy through His commandments, and has commanded us to kindle the lights of Hanukkah.

2. Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam, sheh-asa nisim a'avoteynu, ba'yamim ha-haim ba'zman ha-zeh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the Universe, Who did miracles for our forefathers, in those days at this season.

3. Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam, she-heh-cheyanu, v'kiy'manu, v'higianu la'zman ha-zeh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the Universe, Who has kept us alive, sustained us and brought us to this season.

Now you may light the first Hanukkah candle.

All other nights (Sunday, December 2, 2018- Monday, December 9, 2018)

### **Remember, light the shamash first!**

1. Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam, asher kidshanu b'mitzvotav, v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Hanukkah.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the Universe, Who has made us holy through His commandments, and has commanded us to kindle the lights of Hanukkah.

2. Baruch atah Adonai, eloheynu melech ha-olam, sheh-asa nisim la'avoteynu, ba'yamim ha-haim ba'zman ha-zeh.

Blessed are You, L-rd our G-d, King of the Universe, Who did miracles for our forefathers, in those days at this season.

Now, after the blessings are complete, you may light the remaining candles.
